EXPERIENCE

Creator, composer and performer of Junk Music™. Junk Music is composed/improvised music performed exclusively on junk and recycled materials. Most concerts close with a Junkjam™, where audience members grab a provided stick and piece of junk and everyone becomes a community of rhythm and chanting environmental phrases. Junkjams can also be stand-alone events such as a campus gathering.

- Solo concerts, workshops, and residencies (both music-making and sculpture building) performed at schools, universities, museums, and community organizations worldwide. Educational programs focus upon Knaack's Help Our Planet (HOP) Environmental Education Initiative, which has garnered awards of excellence from the United Nations, the Federal Government of Mexico, and the Governor of Vermont.
- Solo concerts performed worldwide at concert venues and festivals, including World Environment Day at the United Nations, Imagine Watford, Llangollen International Music Eisteddfod, B Love Festival (Basingstoke), Grinagog, The Van's Warped Tour with Eminem and The Black Eyed Peas, The Great Went and Lemonwheel with Phish, The Kennedy Center, Lincoln Center, Music Center Los Angeles, Sundance Film Festival, Seoul Drum Festival, Summer Series Dubai, Escena Contemporana (Madrid), Zagreb Biennale, Summer Series Dubai, and the United Nations COP 16 Climate Change Conference in Cancun, Mexico.
- Created Junk Music Playstations, sound sculptures made exclusively from recycled materials on which 20 to 50 people can jam together. Playstations have been created at First Night Boston, America Creates for the Millennium, Fort Worth Arts Festival, Kansas City International Jazz Festival, Imagine Watford Festival, Discover Jazz Festival (Vermont), Canterbury Faire (Seattle), Snake River Roaring Youth Jam (Idaho), Utah Arts Festival, The Junkyard Museum (Memphis), Greensboro Children's Museum (North

Carolina), Boston Children's Museum, Escana Contemporanea (Madrid, Spain), Summer Series, Dubai (UAE) and First Works Providence (RI). Playstation residencies have been conducted in elementary, middle and high schools in over 30 states in the US, as well as abroad.

- Composed The Environmental Continuum for junk percussion soloist and symphony orchestra and commissioned by Louisville Youth Orchestra, Mansfield Symphony, and Eastern Music Festival Orchestra.
- Composed full-length opera, ODIN, for six spoken word artists/singers, chorus and eleven percussionists performing exclusively on amplified recycled materials. ODIN was workshopped and premiered at New York University. The New York Times stated, "The appeal of the whole thing lay in its youthful energy and striking instrumentation." NPR called it "a complex and contemporary work."
- Junk Music has been featured in television commercials for Air BnB, PowerDot, Paddle to Live, Itinéraire Bis NIKE SB, The NBA, ESPN, and Electronic Arts.
- Junk Music and Knaack have appeared on the BBC, Late Night with Conan O'Brien as well as CBS Sunday Morning, National Public Radio, and CBS News.

HOP also includes our Holistic Environment, which incorporates lessons about inclusiveness, kindness, and

social justice. HOP has been presented with Awards of Excellence from The United Nations, UN COP16 Conference on Climate Change, Federal Republic of Mexico, and the Governor of the State of Vermont.
